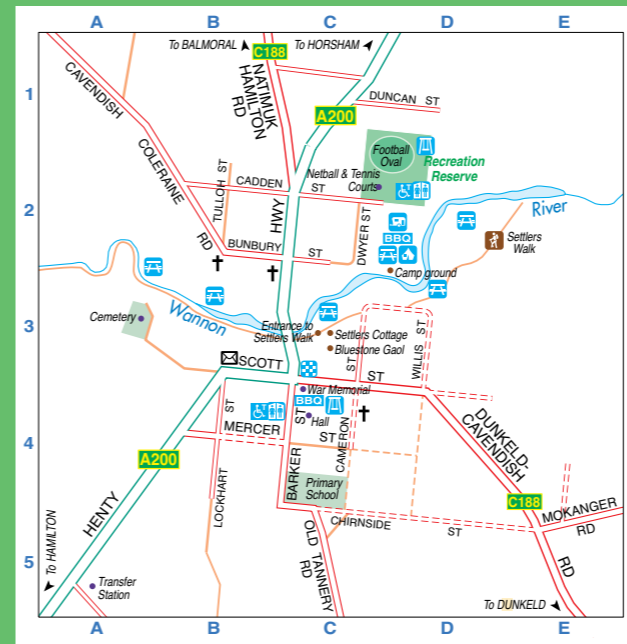

SETTLER'S WALK

The Settler's Walk follows the bank of the river and offers one of the most tranquil and least known experiences in the region.

This is not a busy tourist town and promises a genuine place to relax and observe untouched natural beauty whether camping, having a picnic or just taking a break.

Cavendish offers an experience that travellers will treasure long after they leave this placid country town.

During the day, wander along the Settler's Walk through the mottled light that filters through the eucalypt canopy and learn of the lives of the early settlers to the area and the folklore behind them. The bullock team that disappeared into one of the deep waterholes of the Wannon being one such story.

The lives of local legends are well punctuated by plaques along the walk while the restored settlers cottage offers another glimpse of the past as does the bluestone gaol nearby, built in 1860. Identifying some of the many species of native birds that inhabit the area is not difficult with many appearing along the water's edge

and flying through the trees overhead. Egrets, plovers, blue billed ducks, galahs and swans have enjoyed the area for many years and now you can join them.

At the eastern end of the walk take a seat and admire the pastoral beauty as part of a view of the Grampians. From this site you will understand the excitement and opportunity that drove the early settlers on.

The large watercourse in front of you will be teeming with wildlife through the wetter months of the year and in the drier seasons, sheep and cattle graze the nearby pasture.

At the western end of the walk, about two kilometres away, visit the old Cavendish graveyard not far to the west of the old timber bridge (newly restored). Recognising those who lived through the very first years of European settlement at Cavendish, the graves date back to 1849.

CAMPING BY THE RIVER

At night, campers can easily forget the rigours of modern life as the campfire flames flicker, their light giving a warm glow to the trunks of the majestic red

gums that surround this tranquil area.

For campers looking to find their own piece of tranquillity, this is it, complete with powered sites, showers and toilets.

OPEN GARDENS

The gardens of Wakefield Park, Imogen's Garden and Aranbark have been recognised through their participation in Victoria's Open Garden Scheme.

FOSSICKING

Those looking to find their own fortune may wish to fossick for gemstones and crystals along Hallam's Road (a fossicking license can be obtained from the Department of Environment and Primary Industries).

BRIDGE CAFE & BUNYIP HOTEL

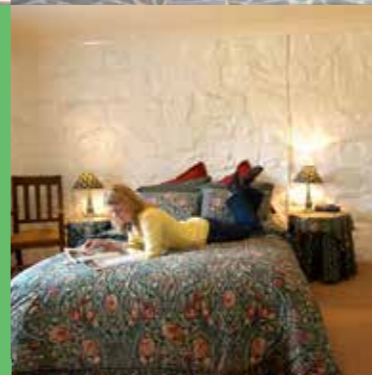
